Preventative Maintenance, Good Planning Proves Cost-Effective

Long Range Planning Improves Reliability

As part of its dedication to longrange planning, the District has completed a survey of long-term land-use plans prepared by local governments to determine if the District has adequate wastewater treatment capacity. The study

ows that the District has planned appropriately and obtained enough long-term treatment plant capacity to accommodate the community's wastewater flows at full buildout.

Remaining Spill Free

Because of good planning and effective maintenance, Goleta West Sanitary District had no major spills over the past six years. This extraordinary achievement not only protects the local environment, but illustrates the effectiveness of the District's maintenance efforts. "It is almost unheard of for a sewer agency to operate with so few spills," said Mark Nation, General Manager/Superintendent of the Sanitary District. "We are proud of our staff, which helped us achieve this environmental distinc-

on and earn us Collection System of the Year in 2003 by a statewide environmental organization." To meet the District's goal of zero sewer spills and cost savings for customers, Goleta West Sanitary District carries out an intensive, carefully planned maintenance program.

It starts with video taping the interiors of pipelines, and then performing engineering analysis of each pipe's age and condition. A detailed database, is maintained on each pipe, and special software helps our professional staff set regular maintenance plans for each length of pipe.

Our field staff regularly clean the pipelines with a special water jet and vacuum truck and also aggressively remove tree roots that infiltrate the pipes. When more substantial upgrades are needed, the District often uses trenchless technology. This allows our crews to rehabilitate aging lines from the inside rather than having to dig them up, limiting environmental disturbance.

Hollister Avenue Pipeline Project To Begin Construction

Construction is expected to begin in early summer on the District's new pipeline along Hollister Avenue.

This project, due for completion by late 2006, will reduce wastewater flows in the aging pipeline along Devereux Creek and lessen the work needed in the environmentally sensitive creek area.

The Devereux Creek pipeline can then be lined from the inside to protect it from developing leaks without major digging along the creek.



Trenchless technology allows rehabilitation of pipelines without harming environmentally sensitive areas like Devereux Creek.

Please Move Your Car on Street Sweeping Day
